### **Exactly what are they all doing?**

### **Stage 1 & Foundation students**

Maths: Students are currently learning to count on and back in 2s, 5s and 10s. Next up, will be recognising and sorting shapes. Followed by grouping numbers in 2s, 5s and 10s. The Autumn term will end with understanding time and dates which can be quite tricky.

**English:** The beginning of the term started with synonyms and antonyms. This will be followed with non-fiction reading comprehensions and then reinforcing phonological awareness emphasising rhythm. The Autumn term will conclude with a focus on building words.

#### Stage 2 students

Maths: We will concentrate on counting on in groups of numbers and number sequences, leading up to negative numbers. They are then moving on to diagrams and charts. Thereafter, they are covering simple fractions, including equivalence. The Autumn term will end with a focus on adding in columns, including money.

**English:** We have been learning about writing to discuss over the last few weeks. They are then moving on to some grammar, with an emphasis on homonyms. Students will then learn and practise persuasive writing. The term will conclude with writing comprehensions, using poetry.

#### **Stage 3 students**

**Maths:** We have started with revisiting time, including understanding how to convert an analogue clock into a 24-hour clock. We will then reinforce short multiplication including multiplication of decimals, ending with learning how to apply long multiplication. They will move on to sequences – looking at the nth term. They will then move on to multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 or 1000.

**English:** The early part of the term is being spent having fun with fictional writing comprehension followed by an emphasis on sentence construction. Reading comprehension with a focus on non-fiction will be our next focus. The term will conclude with revisiting punctuation, emphasising speech marks and apostrophes.

#### **Stage 4 students**

Maths: Multiplying & dividing decimals using columns followed by learning about enlargements are the first challenges of the school year. Dealing with powers, squares & cubes will follow. Then constructions of angles & scaled drawings, and the term will conclude with rearranging equations.

**English:** Writing to persuade, argue and advise is a challenge to us all — and this is the emphasis now. This will follow up with spelling rules and then analysing author's craft. The term will conclude will learning how to plan, draft and present an essay.

## **Tuition Fees**

As you know, we very rarely increase our tuition fees. We've had one fee increase since 2009. It is with regret that it has now become necessary to increase our monthly fees.

The new fees are effective from the 1st October 2019, for all new intake.

We have always kept the fees to an absolute minimum, as you probably know by comparison to other similar organisations.

Any additional siblings will also receive a £5 reduction, per subject.

Registration remains the same at £25.00.

The fee increase will not be applied to you until the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2020, allowing current students 3 months' notice of the increase.

Please change your standing order for the end of December/beginning of January payment.

The GCSE Support Programme fees will remain the same.
